Her Mother's Day grief

Her son dies behind wheel of red Ferrari, leaving behind pregnant wife and daughter

The knock on her front door on the eve of Mother's Day was a precursor to tragedy for this mom.

It was around 7pm yesterday when the police turned up at her doorstep with grave news — her son was dead.

Mrs Wu Chi, a Chinese national, was behind the wheel of the red Ferrari involved in the triple-car vehicle crash yesterday morning.

The 38-year-old was with a car, which then hit a motorcyclist at the junction of Selegie Road and Victoria Street.

Mrs Wu, 38, was pronounced dead at the scene. The son's mother-in-law, Mrs. Tan, was taken to hospital.

On receiving the news, Mrs Wu rushed down to identify her son's body together with her pregnant daughter-in-law, granddaughters and son.

She was emotional and had to be supported as she walked down the stairs.

She had given way before she could recognise the son who she had raised to be a man, despite being a single mom.

The dead man's identity, who had also been married for three years, had not been released yet for mourning.

She could not bear to identify her son's body, leaving her daughter-in-law, granddaughters and son.

Later, she had to be helped supported, had to be carried out of the hospital.

She said: "My son... 'What happened?'"
